FIREARM VIOLATOR & MOST WANTED CAPTURED IN 24 HOURS

PITTSBURGH, PA – Sheriff William P. Mullen announces the apprehension of Jacob Bayton, 36 years of age from Glenshaw and Jared Parker, 26 years of age from Mt. Oliver. Bayton was listed as a Firearm Related Crimes' Fugitive, while Parker was featured as a "Most Wanted" fugitive for the second time in two years.

In 2013, Jacob Bayton was arrested on a multitude of charges regarding a domestic dispute incident, which he pled guilty to Unlawful Restraint (4 charges), Simple Assault, Endangering Welfare of Children (4 charges), Firearms Not to be Carried without License and Recklessly Endangering Another Person. Last month, Bayton was charged with Indirect Criminal Contempt or violation of a PFA. In turn, this violated the terms of his probation from his 2013 conviction and generated a new warrant for parole/probation violation.

Yesterday morning, deputies acquired information that had Bayton staying with his parents at an address in the 3100 block of Harts Run Road in Glenshaw. Upon making contact with residents, deputies searched the home without locating Bayton. However, deputies decided to follow-up with another search due to the amount of personal items in plain view. The second search provided an ideal result, as Bayton was found hiding behind a metal cabinet in a closet. Upon moving the cabinet, deputies noticed a large hole in the drywall, which masked a small crawlspace where Bayton was hiding. The fugitive surrendered and was taken into custody, without incident. Additionally, he was transported to the Allegheny County Jail, where he was lodged on his respective warrant.

Jared Parker had been on the run for nearly a month regarding a probation/parole violation stemming from four prior cases, which he was convicted. The cases span between 2011 through 2015, including guilty pleas of Simple Assault, Harassment, Robbery and Statutory Sexual Assault, as well as others.

This morning, deputies developed information that Parker had a relationship with a woman residing in the 700 block of Climax Street in Allentown. With the assistance of Zone 3 Pittsburgh Police Officers, deputies set up perimeter and made contact with a tenant of the home. While contact was being made, deputies viewed a person matching Parker's description peer out of a second floor bedroom of the house in question, as well as movement on the second floor. At this point authorities rushed to the upstairs of the dwelling where Parker surrendered, without incident. Parker was transported to the Allegheny County Jail and lodged on the aforementioned warrants.

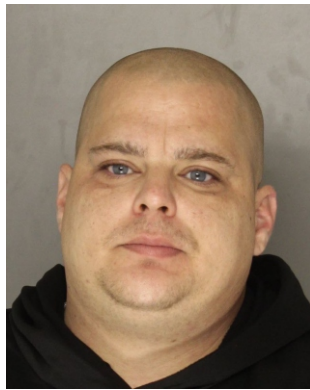
